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Announced U.S. Assistance
to Latin America, 1946–88:
Who Gets It?
How Much? And When?

U.S. authorizations for assistance to Latin America are used for purposes of political propaganda in the recipient countries. Further, such figures add to perceptions in the United States about which countries are benefiting from U.S. policy. It is therefore important to understand that the data involved are announced authorizations. My purpose here is to present as consistently as possible the data needed by policy analysts to better understand U.S. foreign assistance programs. The data presented here allow observers to analyze patterns implicit in the time-series statistics.

This project builds upon earlier work by James Wilkie. In 1974 Wilkie wrote:¹

What is [U.S.] assistance? . . . The following arguments (among others) might be used *against* categories included: Military funds do not really involve assistance because they only have assisted in repression of the population. Peace Corps assistance has done more to assist U.S. citizens in learning about Latin America than to assist in the development of Latin America. Food for Peace has not only stunted the development of Latin American agriculture but lulled recipient nations into an easy solution for feeding a rapidly expanding population, thus making it possible for governments to avoid implementation of controversial but necessary birth-control programs. Since Export-Import Bank loans are granted for the purchase of U.S. produced goods, Latin

Americans pay higher prices than might be obtainable elsewhere, U.S. exporters effectively receiving the assistance in the form of a subsidy. And AID funds, like Social Progress Trust Funds, result in a heavy debt burden for Latin America.

While there is some degree of truth in all of these statements, the following counter arguments are persuasive: Since military items and food will be imported anyway, low or subsidized prices provided by the United States free scarce funds for national development. Export-Import Bank loans have been made at such relatively low interest rates (generally five to six per cent) that the Bank is under fire from U.S. business leaders who note that it charges half the current U.S. rate of interest to finance competition for U.S. concerns. Not only had AID funds involved grants as well as loans, but also the grants exceeded loans until 1962. Interest rate charged on loans by AID is generally much less than one third of the interest rate prevailing in Latin American countries, the AID rate averaging 2.3 per cent yearly between 1961 and 1970. Social Progress Trust Fund loans were administered through the Inter-American Development Bank as part of multilateral instead of bilateral assistance at the same low rates of interest. And no doubt the Peace Corps has planted, at relatively low cost, some seeds of local initiative. In any case, should the reader not agree with any of these categories, they may be deducted from the full data given . . .

Although U.S. interest rates have increased since the 1970s, they are usually lower than market rates and they offer funds otherwise not available.

Further, U.S. assistance is fungible. The matter of fungibility of U.S. assistance has been addressed by Phillip Boucher, who argues that, whether or not U.S. assistance is tied to specific expenditures, it frees otherwise scarce Latin American government funds for discretionary use by officials.²

To help readers understand the data series presented here, I define the categories of assistance and discuss the

methods by which the U.S. government has recorded nominal data. (These methods have varied over time.) One can only see how each of the twenty Latin American nations has fared in relation to the others by deflating the nominal data in relation to the changing value of the dollar (using the Export Price Index) and in relation to the growing population of each nation. The deflated data can then be expressed in terms of the total quantity given yearly to each nation or in terms of the quantity given per capita to each nation.

With regard to the nominal figures on U.S. authorizations for Latin America (and the world), we are fortunate to have the yearly volume *Overseas Loans and Grants and Assistance from International Organizations: Obligations and Loan Authorizations* (USAID-OLG), published at the behest of the U.S. Congress by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). Although these annual volumes are extremely useful in that they give much detail, they are not consistent over time. For example, USAID counted U.S. Export-Import Bank loans in U.S. assistance totals until the 1970s when critics charged that such loans do not constitute assistance; subsequently USAID has published the data apart from the total for U.S. assistance. Here, to remedy this inconsistency, I include Export-Import Bank loans as U.S. assistance, just as I also include U.S. funds directed to Latin America through the Social Progress Trust Fund of the Inter-American Development Bank. (I do not include assistance allocated by international accounts or agencies over which the United States does not have immediate control, e.g., the Inter-American Development Bank itself, the International Monetary Fund [IMF], or the World Bank.) Time has shown criticism of development bank loans to be erroneous—their funds are fungible and do provide new funds that allow governments to spend their budgets in ways otherwise not possible.

With further regard to USAID-OLG, it is important to note that—except for Export-Import figures—the nominal data have been published in gross obligations since the 1972 edition (with publication date of 1973). Data for previous years were published in net terms, which fluctuated with revision as assistance was reduced or changed from the original authorization. In order to know how much assistance has been promised at different times, the data used here are from each volume since 1959.

Data for years prior to 1960 were taken from *U.S. External Assistance, Obligations and Other Commitments, July 1, 1945 through June 30, 1959*, the earliest source used in compiling the data, first published by the International Cooperation Administration and later continued by the AID. It is therefore possible that the data for years prior to 1959 may not be in gross terms, that is, what was actually promised, but rather in net terms, that is, what was actually given.

A similar problem occurred with the data for 1963 and 1964. I was unable to locate copies of USAID-OLG for these fiscal years. Because the title for USAID-OLG includes the years covered in each annual publication (e.g., July 1, 1945 through September 30, 1985), most libraries have discarded

earlier published USAID-OLG upon receiving the next annual publication, not knowing that they were throwing away data that would otherwise be unavailable.

The Agency for International Development refused to provide the USAID-OLG for 1963 and 1964. According to a senior official at USAID, it is not necessary to study the unrevised numbers, and no numbers are completely correct except for those most recently published in USAID-OLG or its companion volume *USAID-OLG Series of Yearly Data* (personal communication). Consequently, the data used in Tables 3500 through 3530 for 1963 and 1964 were taken from the next available publication, USAID-OLG, 1965. It is hoped that little or no revision of the data had occurred up to that time.

As can be seen from this official's lack of understanding that the announced authorizations of assistance to Latin American countries are of value, one can begin to understand why a data series such as that presented here could be vital to policy analysts seeking to study the assistance programs. Although data are published annually for the period of this study, no series of gross authorizations (announced) has been constructed.

Although military assistance data are available for years 1952 through 1959 in *U.S. Foreign Assistance 1960*, they are not included in the tables below because, according to *U.S. External Assistance 1959* (the predecessor to *U.S. Foreign Assistance* and later to the USAID-OLG), this information was classified. Because the purpose of this essay is to present the quantities which Latin American nations were first promised, inclusion of these data would not be consistent with the purpose of this study.

Readers need to know how much the U.S. government has actually disbursed, not just obligated, annually to the countries of Latin America. Presenting this information would require a separate research project more complex than the one at hand. The United States government does not publish data on disbursements. Unfortunately, much of U.S. planning for assistance to Latin America may be wasted precisely because plans not based on reality cannot be carried out effectively, as Wilkie has shown for Bolivia.³ The U.S. Congress should require USAID to gather data on disbursements in the same way that it gathers data on obligations and authorizations. We know that there may be no direct correlation between projected and actual expenditures. Wilkie proves just this in the case of outlays by the Bolivian and Mexican governments as does Gruening for Chile.⁴

For another analysis of U.S. disbursements to Latin America, readers may consult Wilkie's *Statistics and National Policy* (1974, Chapter XVII). Wilkie was able to work with officials in Washington, D.C., to synthesize data from the many agencies involved, but he was not able to continue development of his series because subsequent budgetary "savings" eliminated the positions of U.S. budget officers whose job it was to know how their respective agencies disburse funds.

Regarding development of data on disbursements or actual expenditures, Wilkie has written that few officials in the U.S. government

recognize the value of comparing projected and actual amounts. Indeed, each agency wishes only to be responsible for its own programs perhaps because, in a situation where competition for funds is forceful, if the flow of international assistance funds were understood according to function, some agencies might suffer reduced budgets—presumably if each agency leaves others alone, all will benefit. Although one might have expected the U.S. Department of State to lead the way in gathering full data, such has not been the case; for example, the External Research arm of the State Department has been confined by bureaucratic protocol to investigating non-U.S. affairs. And since the internal orientation of State involves assessing the activity of the Department itself, the arena of assessing the interaction of U.S. assistance with the policy of recipient countries falls between the lines of bureaucratic table of organization charts. Policy, then is evaluated on the basis of projected rather than actual expenditures.⁵

Further, it is Wilkie's view that only with the data on U.S. obligations—as developed here in terms deflated for inflation and population—is it possible for policy makers to determine a fair allocation in relation to each country's need through time.

Readers should note eight parameters of this study.

1. The series date only from 1946 because no earlier information is available. They conclude in 1988, the last year for which data are available at the time of writing. The information for 1989 is available but was not used because USAID informed its subscribers that 1989 USAID-OLG contained errors. (It will be reprinted to correct the errors.)
2. Although only figures for total assistance are graphed (Figures 35:1 through 35:68), I present here the nominal data for four subcategories of economic assistance. The first subcategory is labeled "USAID" and Predecessors. The USAID was created in 1961

by combining the International Cooperation Administration with various other smaller agencies. The second subcategory, labeled "FFP" (Food for Peace, at times called Food for Freedom), gives data for monies and goods promised under Public Law 480. The third subcategory, labeled "EXP/IMP", includes loans given by the Export-Import Bank to help Latin American countries cover their trade deficits, allowing them to continue to purchase goods from the United States. Although some may not regard this as true assistance, it frees funds that can then be used for either military or economic purposes. The fourth, and final, subcategory of economic assistance, labeled "Other," includes money given by the Social Progress Trust Fund and other organizations. The Military category includes monies given as MAP Grants, Credit Financing, Excess Stock, and other programs. The total assistance is the sum of economic and military assistance. This is presented in both nominal and deflated terms.

3. Subtotals for grants and loans are not presented here separately as in USAID-OLG, because in some cases loans have been converted to grants. For such totals, consult USAID-OLG.
4. The concept of "obligations" does not make a distinction between assistance given in the form of cash or in the form of commodities. Commodities donated or sold to Latin American countries constitute "virtual assistance" and—in theory—are valued at market prices by the U.S. government; however—in fact—commodity values are affected by politics. During the height of the Cold War, military commodities may have been overvalued in order to please the U.S. Congress, which was concerned about the "rising tide of world communism." With the waning of guerrilla movements in Latin America at the end of the 1970s, military commodities seem to have been grossly undervalued in order to avoid limitations by the U.S. Congress on U.S. military assistance. No compensation for problems of valuation can be made here; the reader is advised to bear in mind that no data are perfect.
5. This study includes only U.S. assistance allocated to individual countries. It does not include assistance to regions such as Central America. (The reader can note that Central American countries generally receive a higher per capita assistance than do Mexico or South American nations; see Tables 3500 and 3527.)
6. Capitalized interest on loans (interest due for previous years) is added by the U.S. government to totals in the year that it becomes an accrued liability. Such interest should not be confused with new assistance.

7. Deflation of nominal data is developed here through the use of population data and the U.S. Export Price Index (EPI). The latter is more appropriate than the price indexes for U.S. wholesale or consumer goods, which are based on internal U.S. costs. In order to yield standard dollars of 1970, the EPI is keyed to 1970 = 100.
8. The population used as a divisor for calculating per capita U.S. assistance is taken from the series for each of the twenty Latin American countries (see SALA 27, Tables 601-621). Yearly data on total U.S. assistance in dollars of 1970 are divided by the population for each country.

What then can be learned from the following tables and figures? The first set of tables and figures, which present U.S. assistance to Latin America, illustrate several trends. Yearly total assistance and per capita total assistance were greatest during the 1960s when the Alliance for Progress was in full force (Figures 35:1 and 35:2 and Tables 3524 through 3527). Countries can be compared both in terms of the total and per capita assistance that has been authorized to them over the 43 years covered by this study (see Tables 3500 through 3504 and Figures 35:3 and 35:4). For information for each country by year, see either the set of tables and figures presented for each country or summary tables 3524 through 3530.

Although Central American countries receive less than Mexico or South American countries in terms of the total assistance, they in fact receive more money per capita than do most other Latin American countries. Of the top six recipient nations in terms of total assistance, only one is among the top six recipients in terms of per capita assistance. Who then is receiving the most assistance from the United States? A table including data and calculations is presented for each of the twenty Latin American nations (e.g., Argentina: Table 3504 and Figures 35:9, 35:10, and 35:11). The

three figures presented for each country show (i) total assistance (military plus economic), (ii) per capita total assistance, and (iii) the relationship to the average Latin American per capita total assistance. The third figure readily demonstrates whether a particular nation receives more or less than the per capita average for all Latin American nations.

Following the individual country tables and figures (Tables 3504 through 3523 and Figures 35:9 through 35:68), deflated data are presented in summary form for total assistance (Table 3524), economic assistance (Table 3525), and military assistance (Table 3526). Next, tables are presented on per capita assistance (Table 3527), demonstrating how each country compares to the average Latin American per capita and total assistance (Tables 3528 and 3529), and each country's annual percentage of total assistance to Latin America (Table 3530).

It is the author's hope that the data and figures presented here help analysts study U.S. assistance to Latin America. Studies are vital to politicians and economists who determine what quantities of assistance should be given to each country. President George Bush has moved to pump 500 million dollars into Panama and 300 million dollars into Nicaragua, quantities which are disproportionate in per capita terms to amounts received by more populous Latin American nations. This study has shown several ways to present data to permit clearer understanding of where U.S. assistance is focused.

There is a need to analyze not only data on actual disbursements to Latin American nations, but also a need to study the announced assistance. Analyzing what is actually promised to Latin America, in terms of assistance packages, along with what is actually given, will provide analysts with a much better understanding of the U.S. assistance scenario. Knowing who gets assistance, when they get it, and how much they actually receive will allow the assistance program to become more effective.

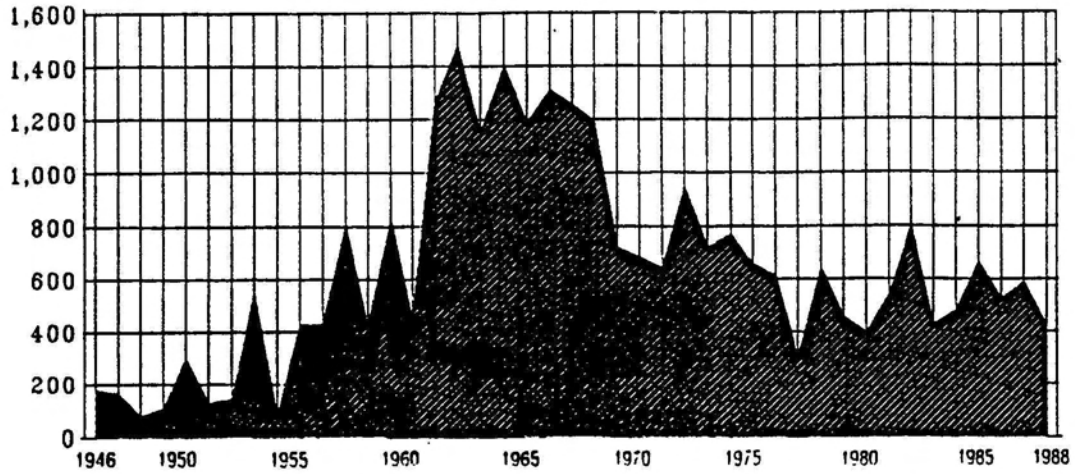

(M US)

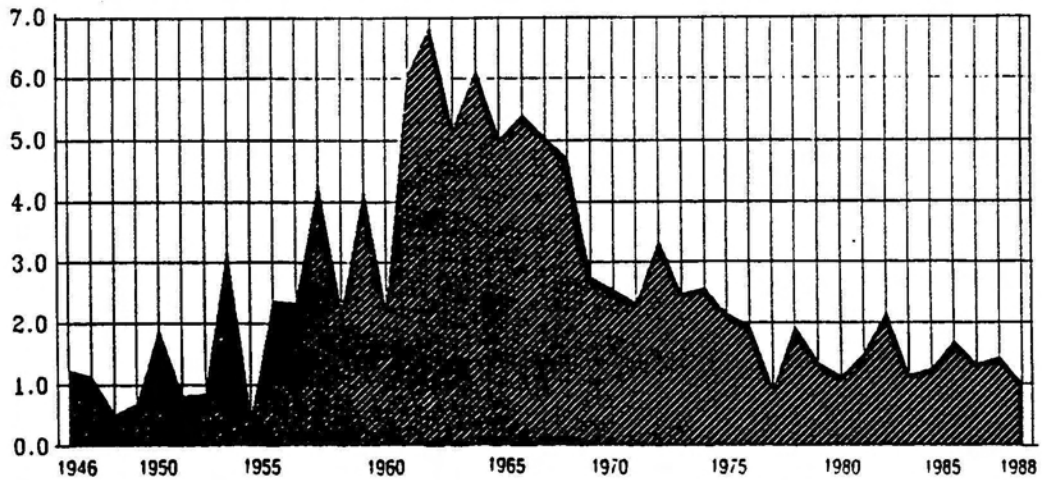

(US)

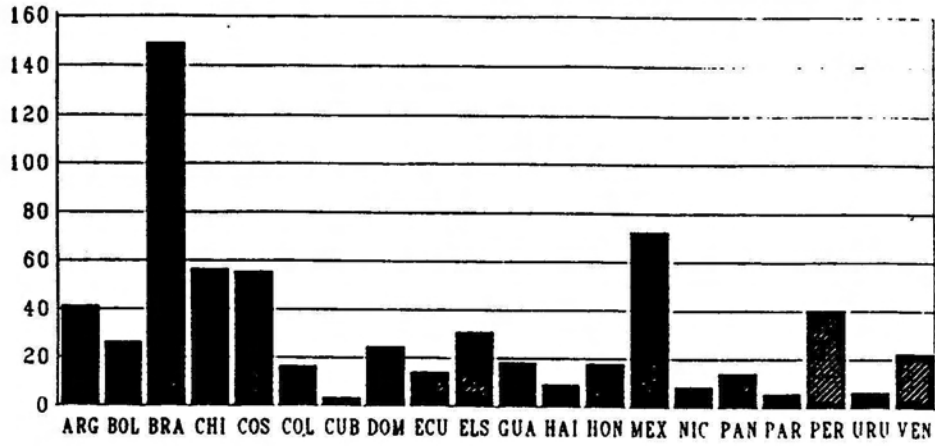

(M US)**

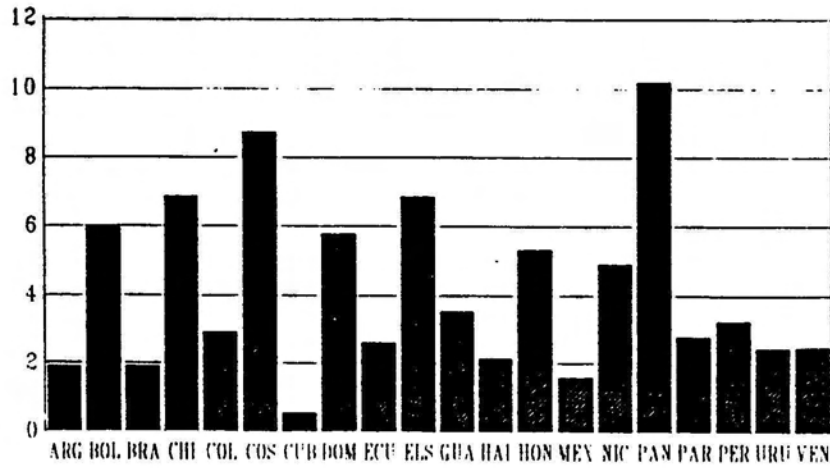

(US)**

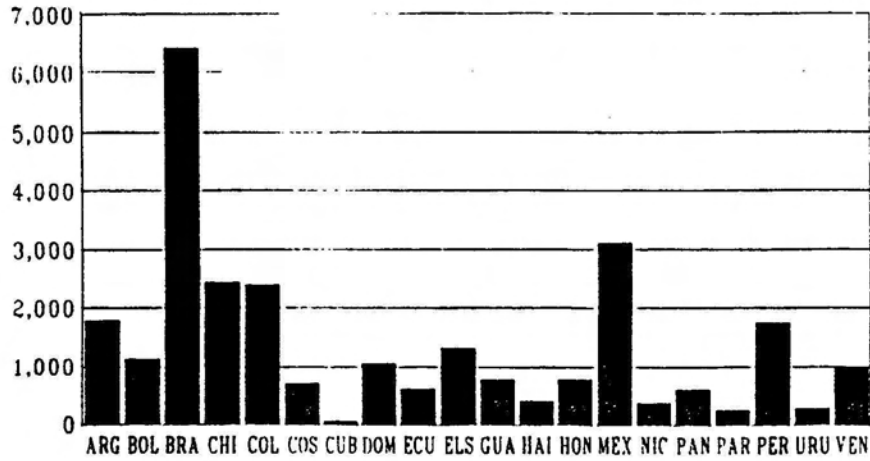

(M US)**

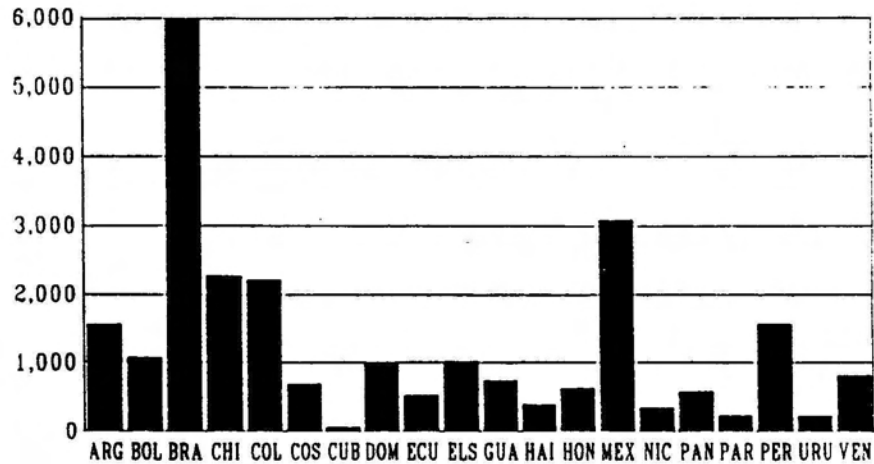

(M US)**

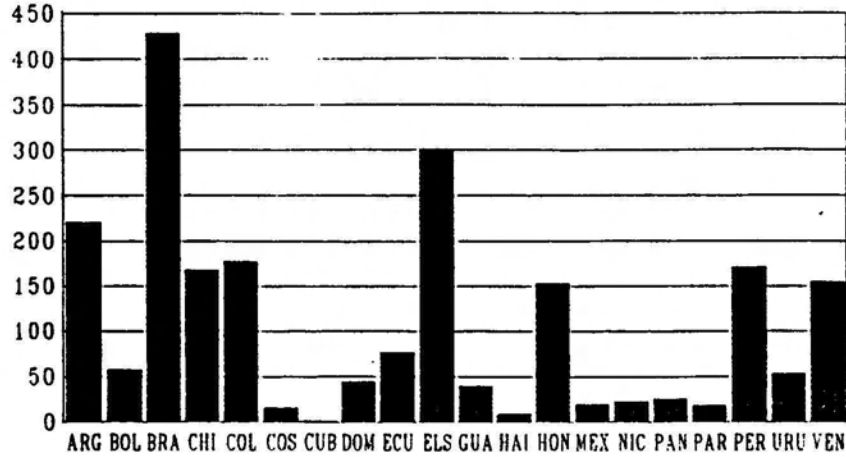

(M US)

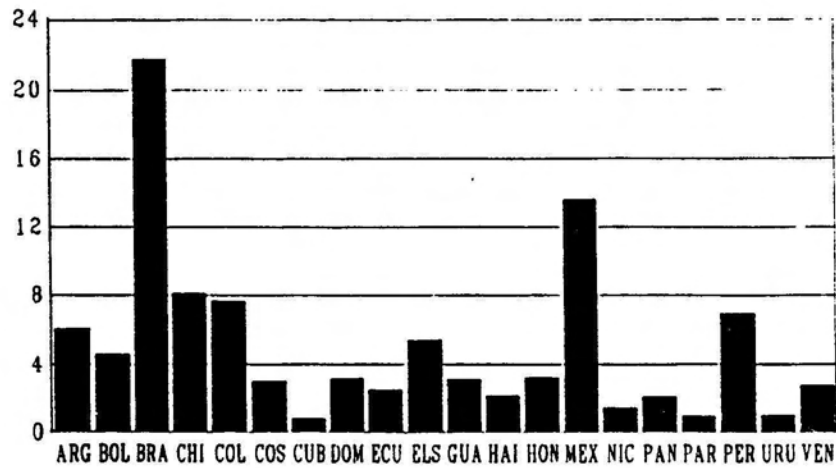

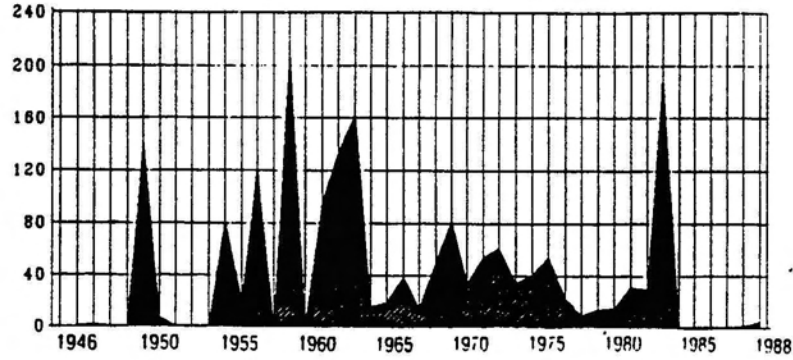

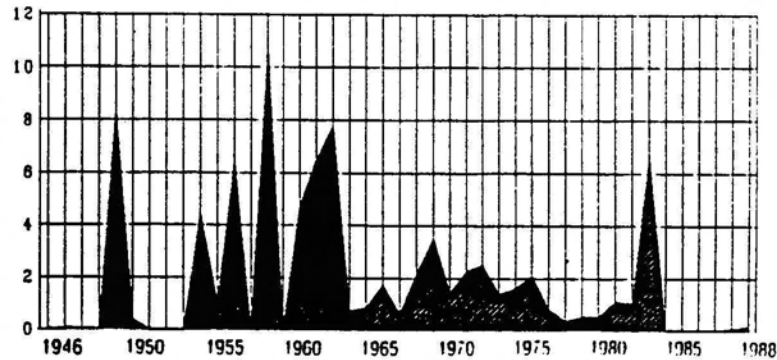
**ARGENTINA: YEARLY ANNOUNCED TOTAL U.S. ASSISTANCE,¹ 1946-88

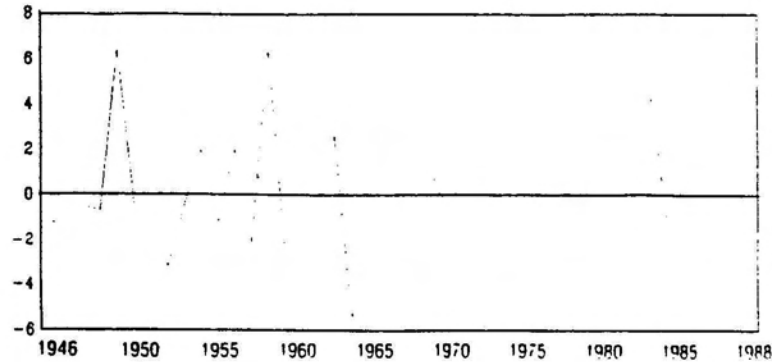
**ARGENTINA: YEARLY PER CAPITA ANNOUNCED TOTAL U.S. ASSISTANCE,¹ 1946-88

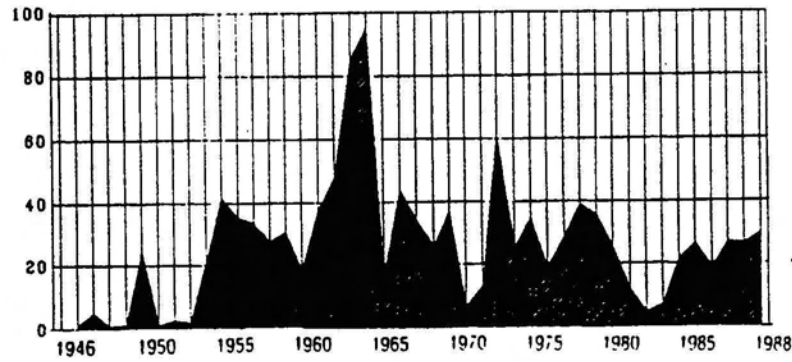

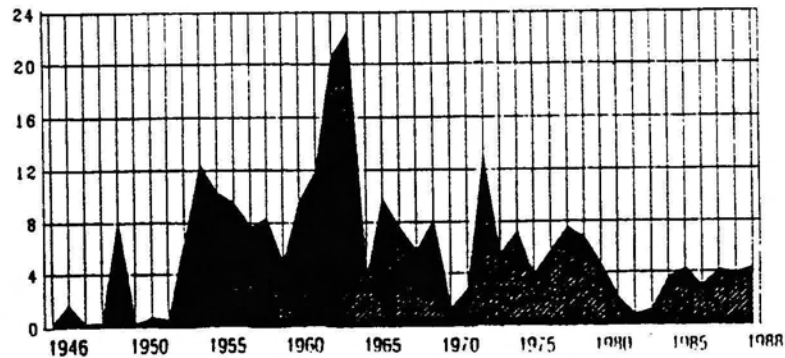
**BOLIVIA: YEARLY ANNOUNCED TOTAL U.S. ASSISTANCE,¹ 1946-88

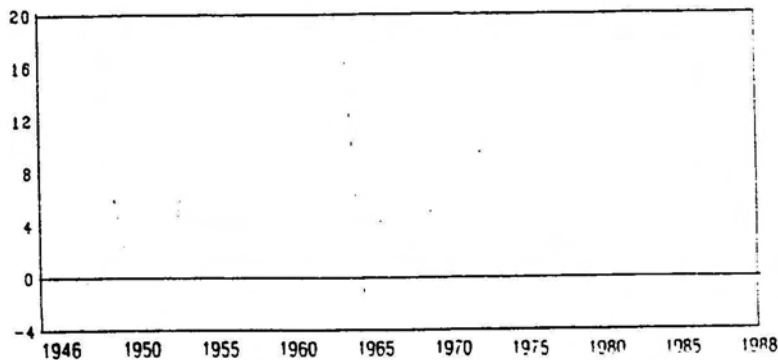
**BOLIVIA: YEARLY PER CAPITA ANNOUNCED TOTAL U.S. ASSISTANCE,¹ 1946-88
